## The ill-starred kisimā: an astrological technique lost in translation

The prognostic technique of direction or prorogation, known in Greek as  $\alpha \varphi \varepsilon \sigma \iota \varphi$  and first described in its classical form by Claudius Ptolemy, was central to the practice of Arabic-language astrology, where it was called  $\alpha v \varepsilon v$ . As the Sanskritization of this astrological tradition began in the thirteenth century, however, the mathematical-astronomical foundations of prorogation were misunderstood, and the technique does not appear to have survived the first generation of Indian practitioners.
